Excel Overview

Excel is a Christian urban leadership development and scholarship program with a four-part strategy:

- (1) Locally recruits and selects a diverse, multicultural cadre of Memphis' most promising urban student leaders.
- (2) Trains these groups of students in the year prior to college, equipping them to support each other, grow as leaders, succeed academically, and grow as service-minded leaders and agents of transformation.
- (3) Helps facilitate the Excel scholarship and send the teams to Union University in Jackson TN or Bethel University in McKenzie TN for four years of faith-based education at a diverse liberal art college.
- (4) Provides campus support and ongoing leadership development to nurture these young people as they find their vocation and grow into the next generation of community leaders.

Who Should Apply

The Excel program each year seeks a diverse, multicultural cadre of promising Memphis' urban student leaders: young people who are passionate about learning, eager to foster intercultural communication and relationships, willing to step out of their comfort zones, committed to serving those around them, and ready to make a difference on their university campus and in their communities at home. The selection process also places high value on students' teamwork, critical thinking, communication skills and academic potential. Financial need and under-represented groups are also a consideration.

Selected scholars will enroll as freshmen in fall 2026. Applicants must be Memphis Tennessee high school seniors planning to graduate in 2026 or must have previously graduated from a Memphis Tennessee high school in 2025 but have never attended a post-secondary school. While ethnicity and family income are considered as factors in selecting an intentionally diverse group of scholars, students from all backgrounds are encouraged to apply. An applicant must be a Tennessee resident and have a minimum ACT score of or near 18 and a high school GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Applicants for Excel must also apply and be accepted to the partner schools of their choice. Those partner schools are Union University or Bethel University.

Selection Process

PHASE I: Applicants complete an initial written application that includes a basic college admissions application as well as additional essay questions, letters of recommendation, and family financial information. After an initial screening, top applicants are invited to participate as candidates in Phase II.

PHASE II: Semifinalists spend time on their selected campuses usually in February/March for an event that will allow students to experience and learn more about Union or Bethel and participate in an evaluation process that includes a personal interview. Housing and meals for the visit are provided by the program.

DECISION: A selection committee will name finalists shortly after the campus visits. Once named, finalists are expected to make a formal commitment to the Excel program upon receiving their financial aid packages. By committing to the program, students agree to attend Union University or Bethel and to

participate fully in the leadership training and preparation program throughout the remainder of the academic year. Applicants may withdraw from the process at any time prior to this commitment.

Selection Timeline

December 31, 2025, All applicants should have completed the FAFSA if eligible.

February 18, 2026, Phase I applications must be postmarked by this date.

February 25, 2026, Phase II candidate semi-finalists selections announced.

March TBA Semi-finalists visit Union or Bethel for Phase II or virtually have selection event and

interviews. Details will be included in the semifinalist packet.

March/April Finalists notified.

March-May 2026 Excel scholars announced.

- 2. Describe a concrete way that your ethnic or cultural background has shaped your life.
- 3. Describe any personal hardships or unusual circumstances you have had to overcome. How have these experiences shaped you as a person and how can they help you in the future?

REQUIRED ESSAY OF CHRISTIAN EXPERIENCE

In addition to the required essay above, the following essay is required of all students wishing to be considered for admission to the Memphis Leadership Foundation – Excel Program. Specifically address each of the following prompts in a single essay:

- How would you describe your view of Christianity?
- Does Jesus Christ impact your personal behavior and morality?
- Using specific examples, describe your spiritual growth during the last three years.
- Describe your present and past involvement in church and ministry activities.

As with your other essay, make sure that your name is printed on the top of each page you submit.



FAFSA Financial Information

Deadline: February 18, 2026, Part 3

Because of the nature of the Excel scholarship commitment and the desire of the program to select an economically diverse cadre, it is important that we have accurate information regarding each applicant's financial situation. In order to provide an accurate estimate of the actual Excel award at the time of selection, it is critical that Excel, Union University, Bethel and each applicant's family have an accurate estimate of the applicant's Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

A student's EFC is ultimately determined by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA requires a PIN and should be requested before you begin the application process.

The following steps are required to complete this part of the application:

- (1) Visit www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- (2) Complete the FAFSA with your 2024 year taxes. Then you will indicate "have filed" your taxes and not be required to go back and update your FAFSA.
- (3) When you reach the end of the process, you need to print two important screens:

 - CONFIRMATION SCREEN: This screen shows your estimated SAI and tells you how much federal student aid you might be eligible to receive.

(4) Use the information provided on the printed summary and confirmation screens to fill in the four questions in the Summary Figures section on the next page, and then <u>submit copies of the two printouts behind the two pages from this part of the Excel application</u>.
